Dear Applicant:

The following information contains the admission criteria and all materials necessary for filing an application for admission to Our Lady of Lourdes School of Nursing. Application to Camden County College may be done online at http://www.camdencc.edu.

Our Lady of Lourdes School of Nursing requires a fifty dollar (\$50) application fee. There is no fee required to apply to Camden County College.

Your application will be reviewed after the following items are received by the School of Nursing:

- 1. Official high school transcript or proof of GED.
- 2. Official transcripts from any and all previously attended colleges, including Camden County College.
- 3. Two letters of recommendation from an instructor or an employer. If you are coming from another nursing program, at least one (1) letter must be from a former instructor of that program. If you are a **high school senior**, one (1) letter must be from your Guidance Counselor.
- 4. Minimum overall college grade point average (GPA) of 2.80 with a grade of "C" or better in all curriculum courses must be achieved to be eligible to begin the nursing program. If you do not have a college GPA, your overall high school GPA must be a minimum of 2.80. Minimum GPA does not guarantee acceptance into the Program.
- 5. Completion of high school lab Biology and lab Chemistry or college equivalent with a grade of "C" or better.
- 6. Report for the TEAS V (Test of Essential Academic Skills, Level 5) with a minimum score at the Proficient Level, 58.7 %.
- 7. 100 word essay on "Why I Want to Enter the Nursing Profession"
- 8. "Abilities Considered Essential for Nursing Practice" Form

The TOEFL iBT (Test of English as a Foreign Language) scores are required for applicants who do not have a U.S. high school diploma. The scores required are as follows: Writing: 25, Reading: 21, Listening: 17, and Speaking: 26.

- 40 students are accepted to the nursing program in the Fall and Spring semesters.
- Students must complete all Year I First and Second Semester courses within the first 3 consecutive academic semesters following acceptance into the Nursing Program.

Applications will expire one year after application date if not completed and reviewed in that time period.
